 - Due to picture taking and other delays after the wedding ceremony, it is common for the wedding party to arrive at the reception site much later than the guests. Therefore many couples choose to make a grand entrance and have an announcement made at their arrival to the reception. The wedding party should line up in order outside of the entrance to the reception room and enter one at a time after the DJ or emcee announces them. This is a great way to create a joyful, celebratory mood and signify the start of the festivities.
